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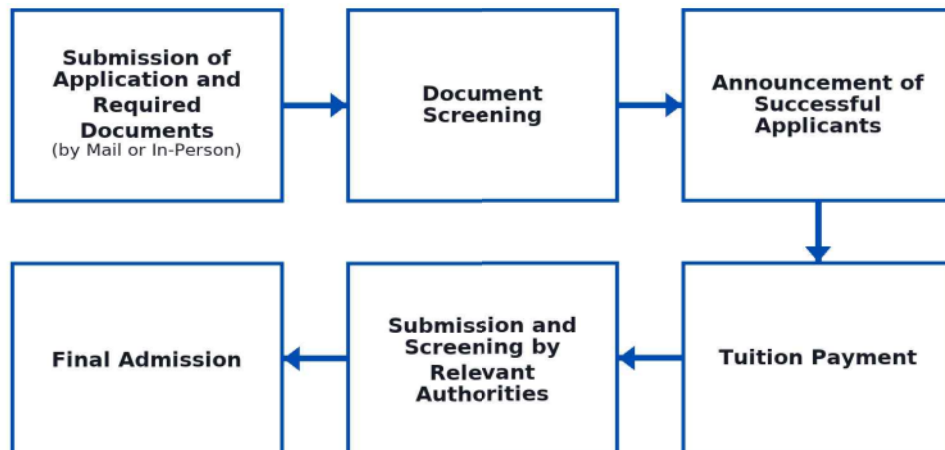

Educational Background	■ High school graduates or those recognized as having equivalent or higher education – Applicants graduating from overseas high schools must meet graduation requirements by August 31, 2026. – Educational backgrounds such as GED, homeschooling, or cyber-learning are not accepted

Category	Eligibility Requirements
Nationality	■ Both applicant and parents hold foreign nationality – Applicants who acquired foreign nationality through immigration or adoption must submit proof of nationality acquisition. – Applicants who previously held Korean nationality must submit official documents proving the loss or renunciation of Korean nationality (e.g., Certificate of Loss /Renunciation of Nationality, Family Relation Certificate), as well as documents verifying the timing of foreign nationality acquisition. ■ North Korean Defectors – A person registered as a North Korean defector under the 「Act on the Protection and Settlement Support of North Korean Defectors」, who has completed the entire curriculum equivalent to elementary and secondary education in the Republic of Korea, and who has graduated from (or is expected to graduate from) a high school in Korea or abroad, or who possesses educational qualifications recognized by law as equivalent thereto. ■ Mid-entry immigrant youth may be admitted provided that they satisfy the academic qualification requirements.
Language (Select 1)	■ Korean Language Proficiency Qualification (Mandatory) – Holder of TOPIK Level 2 or higher – Completion of the Beginner 2 level or above in a Korean language course at the King Sejong Institute. – Completion of Level 2 or higher of the Korea Immigration and Integration Program (KIIP), or a score of 41 points or above on the KIIP Pre-Assessment. ■ Selection of those who have completed a Korean language course at a domestic university will be determined after a university interview – Completion of Level 4 or higher at Munkyeong College or a Korean language institute at another university. – Those recommended as possessing sufficient proficiency in the Korean language.

All Departments	Document Screening	Applicants will be selected through a comprehensive evaluation based on submitted documents, including academic ability, aptitude related to the chosen department, language proficiency, and both academic and extracurricular activities. Applicants who fail to submit original documents will be disqualified. Submitted documents must comply with Ministry of Justice regulations regarding application standards. Information regarding applicant eligibility, evaluation details, and reasons for disqualification will remain confidential.

■ Notes on Document Submission

- 1) Original documents must be submitted. Any documents written in languages other than English must be accompanied by a notarized Korean or English translation and submitted together with the original copies.
- 2) If there are any discrepancies in the applicant's name or date of birth among the submitted documents, a certificate verifying identity must be attached.
- 3) Personal statement must be written in Korean or English using the Korean format.
- 4) Chinese applicants must obtain and submit academic verification documents for their high school and university education by applying to either the Seoul Confucius Academy (<http://www.cis.or.kr>) or the authorized verification centers in China (www.chsi.com.cn/www.cdgd.edu.cn). This process may take approximately 30 days, so applicants are advised to apply in advance. In addition, when the verification documents are issued personally through the Chinese verification centers, they are only valid for the online verification period (usually valid for 30 days, which can be extended).
- 5) If it is not possible to submit an academic verification certificate, applicants must submit the original high school graduation certificate authenticated by the Korean Consulate in the applicant's country.
- 6) Students who have completed their studies in a third country must submit a Certificate of Academic Recognition for Studies in a Third Country issued by the head of the Korean diplomatic mission abroad.

- 7) North Korean defectors must submit a high school diploma issued by a city, county, or district office, a North Korean defector registration confirmation, a copy of their resident registration, and one self-introduction letter.
- 8) The university may request additional documents individually if deemed necessary.
- 9) Students applying for a visa from abroad must obtain two copies each of the Certificate of Academic Credentials and the Certificate of Bank Balance; one copy must be submitted to this university, and the other must be submitted directly to the consulate of the relevant country at the time of visa application. As the documents required for a visa application may vary by country or province, applicants must check in advance.
